1) Welcome Address by AIMT Director:

The IQAC Chairperson & Director, AIMT welcomed all the members of IQAC with a special Mussarat Hussain from Maruti Udyog, Mr. (Employer/Industrialist) along with Mr. Gurneet Singh Punia, AIMT Alumini. The meeting started at 11:30 AM through the online MS Teams Platform. The Director briefed the team members about the activities conducted during 1 st Quarter 2021. He briefed that last year AIMT has completed the NAAC Re-accreditation cycle and according to the NAAC requirements IOAC committee have been reconstituted. He talked about the purpose of IQAC to channelize and prioritize the efforts towards the holistic academic excellence including actions of peer committee members. He also guided to focus on the students as they are the end customers. Hence, all activities should be channelized with the objective of holistic development of the institute. He further said that two phenomenal MOUs signed recently, one with MIT ADT University Pune and 2nd with Govt. Institute of Medical Sciences.
