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






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Editorial




Sport Activities

She welcomed us with a warm smile as we entered her home at AWHO, Greater Noida, where she's staying with her parents. **Ms Priha Avtar** of MBA-05 completed her schooling from Bhartiya Vidya Bhawan, Chandigarh. She then did her Hotel Management from IHM, Aurangabad and BBA as well. She got campus placed from IHM at Marriott International where she worked for 2 years before joining AIMT. She has been staying in Greater Noida since 2008. Presently she's working as a **Sr. Consultant at People Connect.**

How would you explain your experience at AIMT?

It was a really good experience mainly because of the batch mates and excellent faculty members. The subjects were tough but my batch mates helped me a lot. AIMT offers a great blend of academics and co-curricular activities. I will admit while we were there, we used to crib a lot but we realised the value after getting out and we miss our time there.

What change would you like to see in AIMT?

Too much pressure is put upon bookish knowledge. The focus should be diverted towards discussing current events and more emphasis on communication, personality development and presentation skills should be given. You know, if you can communicate well, half the battle is won. Make sure you are reading well. I agree, even I don't like reading Economic Times but you should be aware of the market conditions and be abreast with happenings around the globe.

Why HR?

The thing about HR is you've to know about all the fields as you've to recruit everyone from engineers to finance specialists. That way you get to know about all different areas. Nowadays, you've to be a jack of all trades. To be honest, I wasn't good in Finance, Marketing is not cup of my tea, International Business got introduced later, so it wasn't an option and I wasn't very keen on taking up IT so it had to be HR. And I chose Marketing as my minor.

How was your placement experience at AIMT?

Firstly, look at the role and don't run after the brand name. It is better to be at the right job in the wrong industry than to be in a wrong job in the right industry. Secondly, it is most important to be very happy with what you're doing. During our time at AIMT, only one or two HR companies came. Amrapali, being one of them, came and absorbed half the batch including me although I didn't go for it because I didn't want to go where everyone was going. I didn't work for six months after completing MBA.

Was it difficult opting for an off campus placement?

I registered with the Naukri portal and that is how I got selected at People Connect. I had the option to go back to Marriott. But I decided that I wanted to explore other sectors. I sometimes think about going back to Marriott – they still want me back. But the kind of exposure and clientele I have at People Connect, I'm content.

Tell us about your profile at People Connect?

I joined as a management trainee initially. I've now been promoted to the post of Senior Consultant. So, the kind of recruitment that we do is Niche. We recruit for leadership roles which are generally executive positions in the organisation. So we get a lot of exposure, we've to recruit and then communicate with them about the roles that they are expected to carry out.

It adds to your personal grooming as you get a holistic exposure. 70% of roles in HR accounts for recruitment. Manpower management is very crucial.

How has your job affected your lifestyle?

There are not many opportunities in Greater Noida but I wanted to stay at home with my parents as right from 12th grade I'd been studying in the hostel. I got offers from Gurgaon but I waited and finally got People Connect at Noida. Working has taught me to be more mature and patient. Maybe that can be attributed to the fact that I'd been working earlier before joining AIMT. But patience is very important when you're working. I've been working here since the past two and a half years. And it's good. I learn every day.



What is it that you practice to keep your skills updated?

Well, once I had to recruit for a post in an Oil and Gas Company. So, I had to read up about the sector to understand the role that the client is demanding and the kind of employee they are looking for to fill that post. I had absolutely no knowledge about the Oil and Gas sector. So, that is how I gain knowledge about all the sectors that come my way. And the best source of gaining information is through the candidates themselves.

So what do you do during your leisure time?

I sleep, I meet my friends, and I watch a lot of movies. I read a lot. Presently I am reading Barrack Obama's Autobiography and a book on Corporate Management.

What would you like to say to your junior AIMTians?

Get away from your course books! Don't ignore them completely. What I mean to say is – think out of the box. Interact with people who are working. Plan your internships, do it in the field that you're interested in. And, remember, networking is very important. You all should have an account on LinkedIn. Good luck!!
